Good attendance is 95%+ and 100% represents excellent attendance.


260 students with 100% attendance - wonderful to see! Next half term students with 100% attendance will be invited to a Christmas Film and popcorn!

Each week, the students are given an opportunity to participate in a democratic voting experience as part of their tutor time. We will share the responses of our students with you.



Start Safe Stay Safe App

A new app, Start Safe, Stay Safe, has been launched to improve street safety in York and North Yorkshire.
