With 1 more week (5 days!) until the February half term break we are hoping we can shoot above 90% next week across all year groups. This half term has shown us that our attendance is increasing significantly and we are moving in the right direction.

Our attendance team is sending text messages, making calls and doing home visits every day to support improving attendance.

During form time tutors are awarding achievement points for outstanding, great and good attendance to recognise each individual student and their effort. Alongside this tutors are talking to students about their individual attendance and making sure the support is in place.

We have introduced 'Attendance Streaks' cards where students have a set number of days needed to reach above 90% attendance. These are run by form tutors and students are responding well to gaining 'streaks'!

Students with 98% attendance for this half term will be able to watch a film on the last day of term alongside rewards for the promoted form teams and individual raffle tokens!



Teaching and Learning Update from Miss

Next week all KS3 classes will be completing their reading plus assessment on Thursday. This is crucial data for us to collect in order to ensure we can put any relevant support in place for students to develop their reading.

Behaviour Weekly Focus and Update from Mr Donaldson, Assistant Vice Principal

We have some significant changes taking place with regards to behaviour sanctions next week, and until further notice. Students found truanting in school, or any student walking away from staff trying to support or direct them on corridors, will receive automatic 3 day suspensions.

The students whose behaviour has prompted this change are a very small group, however, their conduct cannot be allowed to impact the vast majority of students, who are thoroughly engaged in their education.

Rather than having any responsibility for finding their own Safety Nets (a secondary classroom students are moved to after receiving a Phase 3 in their lesson), students will now be collected by On Call staff and relocated. This is to prevent any confusion as to why students are out of lesson, and to prevent any undeserved sanctions being issued.

We have also been experiencing a high number of students trying to use lesson time to refill drinks bottles. The water fountains are available at all social times and in between classes, but should not be used during lessons. It is the expectation that students refill their water bottles at the times provided, rather than during lesson. This will again prevent any misunderstandings when students are on corridors.

The standard policy for use of toilets remains unchanged- students are permitted to use the toilets in the middle 30 minutes of lesson, but not in the first 15 or last 15 minutes of a lesson. Students with existing toilet passes will not experience any change to their support.

These changes will be communicated to students within school, but please emphasise this at home to prevent any misunderstanding on their part.
