
Finally, we would like to share some of the incredible results from the Year 11 students. 70.9% of students attained grade 4+ in English and Maths and 50.4% of students attained grade 5+ in English and Maths, both above national average. English results at 5+ were 70.2%, placing Vale of York 4th overall in the city. We are very proud of what the students achieved and are working hard with our current students to hopefully exceed this performance further. Again, I would like to congratulate the outgoing Year 11 students on their results.

working with you all in the future and getting to know the wonderful Vale of York community.


Behaviour Weekly Focus and Update from Mr Donaldson, Assistant Vice Principal And here we are - hello again!


Attendance Update from Miss Garland, Assistant Vice Principal
